NOLLYWOOD STARS OUT IN FORCE AT SKY'S ROK TV LAUNCH

Free-to-view channel will be available to all subscribers

HE LAUNCH of a new Sky channel broadcasting thousands of Nigerian films and TV shows was attended by top Nollywood and British film stars.

ROK TV, an award-winning Nollywood film studio, headed up by actress and producer Mary Njoku, will broadcast 24 hours a day, seven days a week and will be available to all Sky subscribers on channel 344.

The launch of the new channel saw names including Mercy Aigbe Gentry, Yvonne Jegede, Chief Patience Ozokwor, Desmond Elliot, Alexx Ekubo, John Dumelo and Jackie Appiah descend upon central London's Northumberland
